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How to Use This Book

The book you now have in your hands has been a labor of love. It began with a realization that no matter how excellent and effective our teaching may be, it cannot compete with the influence of you as parents. God has called you specifically and gifted you uniquely to lead your kids “in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.” Plainly said, you are the greatest spiritual influence in the lives of your kids. To some of you that is a very intimidating and overwhelming thought (I know I feel that way).

Therefore, we as the church want to help encourage and equip you in your role as the primary discipler of your children, and that is why this book exists. Our goal is to set you up in the best way that we can to have spiritual conversations as a family. Our hope is that you will have opportunities on Sundays, perhaps at lunch after Sunday school, as well as a couple of times a week with the Family Devotionals provided, to talk about God and His importance in our everyday lives.

To help accomplish this, we have standardized the Sunday school curriculum so that everyone from JK-12th grade will be learning the same things each week (age appropriately, of course). This allows you as parents to know exactly what all of your kids are learning without having to keep track of multiple e-mails or schedules. Below you will find exactly what is included and how best to use it.

Outline

We provide you with the main points that your students will be learning each week. We do this so you can be best prepared to discuss what they learned and answer any questions that might come up. We also have included a lengthy section of context for each lesson. We believe it is important for all of us to see how each story in the Bible does not stand alone, but instead fits into the larger drama that God has unfolded.

FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS

The point of these questions is to be conversation starters for you as a family. They are not exhaustive as to the content of what your children have learned that Sunday, but should just get things started for your family. Our hope is that your children will come to expect a conversation about what they learned in Sunday school for two main reasons. First, we want them to see spiritual conversations as a normal and important part of life and second, we hope this expectation will make them more attentive to what they are learning.

FAMILY DEVOS

We have provided two days worth of Family Devotionals for you to do as a family at home. We chose this number so as to not overwhelm families or discourage them for not being able to live up to expectations. Our hope is that the two provided will be a springboard for even more times of family worship during the

How To Do Family Devotions

When discussing family devotions, the first thing you must know is that there is not just one correct way to do them. Each family is made up of distinct individuals, each with a different personality. Therefore, trying to create a “one-size-fits-all” approach to family devotions is foolish. Below are some helpful hints and guidelines as you lead your devotions. Some of them will be very helpful, while some you will realize do not work for your family. In the end, the point is for you as a family to take time together, reading God’s Word and praying together. However you accomplish this is truly a secondary concern.

PLACE MATTERS

- It will be important to find a consistent place where you always do family devotions. Changing the location can drastically change the dynamics.
- Everyone should be at the same eye level. You don’t want some on the floor and some in chairs or on the couch. This will encourage participation by all members because they will feel as if they are a part of the group.
- Minimize the distractions. Honestly, doing family devotions is hard enough! Only you know what might distract your kids so be sure you eliminate as many interruptions as possible.

PRAYER MATTERS

- It is important for your children to see the importance of prayer. Therefore, be sure that you pray to begin and end your time together. Often it works best to choose one family member to open the time in prayer (which also helps settle busy hearts). At the end is an opportunity to let everyone pray.
- Give your children a role in prayer. One of the things that my family does that has been successful is that we have four prayer categories: 1- Zachary’s class, 2- Bryson’s Class, 3- Our extended family and friends, and 4- Missions. Each time we give someone in the house one of these prayer categories. To minimize the “I want...” of our children, we rotate who assigns who to prayer. That way, everyone gets a chance to decide who prays for what. It has saved a lot of disagreements. For our missions category, we alternate between a Mission Memphis partner and a World Missions partner and it has been such a blessing to watch and hear our kids pick up on and pray for those ministries. We also switch it up some nights and just have a time of confession or adoration or thanksgiving so they don’t think of God as just someone from whom you ask things.

THE WORD MATTERS

- God’s Word is the only thing He promises will bear fruit. It is so important to not only expose them to God’s Word but also to teach them how to think about it. One of the best ways to start doing this is to continually remind them that these stories are REAL – Isaiah 55:11.
- Get them to interact with the Bible for themselves. It is a huge temptation to just provide the answers for them (since we know everything) but they will get so much more out of it if they think

about it for themselves. The hardest part for me in this is that I lose the control. I have to constantly remind myself that I want them to get something out of God's Word and not get frustrated when they don't get out what I want them to.

- Encourage every little step. It will be very important to encourage every interaction they have with God's Word. They will be more willing to share when they know it is a safe place for them to come with their thoughts. At times, that will mean you are going to go down some rabbit trails, but it will be worth the journey. As a part of that, you need to make sure that they get the truth; this means gently correcting when their theology gets out of whack.

TIME MATTERS

- One of the most important things you are teaching your children is that being together is very important. Just the simple act of carving out time every week that does not involve the TV or a meal out will bear fruit. The intentional act of studying the Word and prayer together will bear fruit even if it is down the line.
- Have fun! I know it sounds silly but if your kids have fun doing family devotions, they will want to keep doing them. For us, that is a short game or a role playing moment at the beginning but for you, it can be whatever. Sometimes I think we are afraid that we will be irreverent when we attempt to have fun, but we must remember that God created fun and laughter, so participating in those activities pleases Him.

D6 Driving Values

At Second, we believe in three guiding principles, known as the D6 Driving Values. We hope that as you and your family go through these devotions together, you will be further encouraged in your relationship with the Lord, your church community, and in your Kingdom mission.

The Lord is My Primary Devotion

- Confronted by the holiness of Christ, I seek Him in daily worship, prayer, and repentance. *Isaiah 6:1-8*
- Compelled by the love of Christ, I strive to be obedient to Him in my thoughts, words, and deeds. *II Corinthians 5:14*
- Created new in Christ, my identity is no longer in the things of this world. *II Corinthians 5:17*
- Confident of the eternity secured for me in Christ, I have peace in the midst of the troubles of this life. *Phillipians 4:6-7*

The Church is My Primary Community

- Knowing that the Gospel liberates me from idols, I cannot imagine not joyfully worshipping God every week with my brothers and sisters in Christ. *Thessalonians 1:9b*
- Knowing that the Church is called to be a holy nation, set apart from the things of the world, I will embrace this calling by seeking to be Christ-like in all aspects of my life. *I Peter 2:9-12*
- Knowing that I am a steward of my resources and not an owner, I cheerfully release my resources to build His Kingdom and not my own. *Matthew 25:14-30*

Psalms

The book of Psalms has long been a favored book among Christians. You can't go far today without seeing a verse from the Psalms plastered on a coffee mug or attached to a social media post. The Psalms were always meant to be more than just an uplifting thought for the day. Instead their purpose was to speak deeply into our hearts. Whereas much of the Old Testament books recounted the lives of God's people out in the world, the book of Psalms reflected what their lives should be about in the Temple as they worshipped God.

The book of Psalms is a collection of poems written by at least four different authors (Moses, David, Solomon and Asaph) and a group of authors (Sons of Korah) written from the time of the Passover all the way through the exile. Although there was variety in authors and contexts, the purpose remained the same: the worship of the One, True and Living God. One of the distinctive elements of the Psalms, which makes them so beloved and accessible, is the transparency and vulnerability of the authors. The Lord used people such as David and the circumstances of their lives to benefit His people thousands of years later. We get the unique privilege of seeing into the private thoughts that were deep in David's heart as if we were reading his diary or journal. His honesty with and before the Lord in good times and bad encourages us all to approach our prayers in the same way. He challenges us to prove whether we think we can truly be honest with God and still be loved and accepted by Him as His people.

Overall, the Psalms are a book of praises. Most of the prayers and poems found in the Psalms have either musical terms included with them (most of which we are unable to fully translate) or are prefaced with instructions for the choirmaster, thus revealing that they were meant to be sung by the congregation (and in the early church that is exactly how the Psalms were used). As you read through the Psalms, you will see how they have been the literary inspiration for so many of the hymns and worship songs we use today. God is making plain that His Word is not to be read as just an intellectual exercise but is meant to penetrate to the deepest core of who we are and be used to express the cries of our heart back to the Lord.

This summer, we will focus on the Psalms that reveal who God is and what He has done. Next summer, we will focus more on our response to the Lord. However, each Psalm includes both parts: God's revelation and our response. In family devotions, I will encourage the singing of Psalms as a way to express our worship and also reinforce God's design for His Word. For each lesson I have included a song based on the Psalm we are studying with a YouTube clip so you can sing it at home. My prayer is that this summer you will get a foretaste of what is to come for us as believers and that you will gladly begin to do that for which you were created: to praise the Lord. May God use His Word to engage your heart in a new way, that you will be encouraged to raise your voice in thanksgiving and praise your Lord and God.

Ultimately, what I want us to do is see Jesus for who He truly is (the embodiment of God the Father) and once we do to find Him ultimately fulfilling and beautiful. Based on those assumptions, my hope and goal is to answer these fundamental questions with each account of Jesus we study:

- What does this account tell me about Jesus?
- Why is it important that Jesus is this or does this for me?
- How should I live differently because of who Jesus is?

- A psalm written by David
- Unlike many other of the psalms, we get no instructions as to whether this is to be sung or not
- Therefore we can see it as a prayer of David's heart

 - a. Romans 5:8
 - 4. Jesus makes us clean before God so we can approach Him

III. Who is the King of Glory?

- A. The Lord
 - 1. Strong and mighty in battle
- B. The Lord of Hosts
 - 1. Word "hosts" also means armies
 - 2. Can refer to angels–Psalm 103:20-21
 - 3. Can refer to all believers–2 Timothy 2:3-4
 - a. We are therefore God's army to do His will
- C. Points to what is to come–His glory
 - 1. Will deliver Jerusalem from their enemies
 - a. Zechariah 14:9
 - 2. Heaven
 - a. Jesus sitting on the throne to reign as king

b. Revelation 21:1-8

- Was directed to Jeduthun – one of three musicians that David put in charge of worship (1 Chronicles 16:37-43, 2 Chronicles 5:12; 35:15)

 - A. Word for alone is also translated “indeed or verily”
 1. Conveys meaning of absolute certainty
 - B. Brings our salvation
 - C. He is our Rock
 1. We will not be greatly shaken

 1. Trusting Him
- II. **God ALONE is our hope—verses 5-10**
 - A. Repeats that He is our rock, salvation and fortress

 - a. More confidence in the Lord
 - b. Even in hard times He is steady for us
 - c. The more we see God as our Rock the greater the calmness in our heart

- B. We are to trust in Him at all times
 - 1. Pour our hearts out before Him
 - 2. Repeated that our souls should wait in silence
 - a. The verb is a command in this verse
- C. What not to hope in
 - 1. Things of this world
 - a. All people are but a breath
 - i. James 4:14
 - b. Riches do not last or satisfy
 - i. Job 1:21

III. God ALONE rewards us—verses 11-12

- A. God speaks so it is sure
- B. God ALONE has the power to give
 - 1. Steadfast love
 - 2. Give a man what his work deserves
 - a. God sees and knows what we do

 3. He will bring them to glory
 4. They have nothing apart from Him
 5. He is their strength and portion forever

IV. God reminds them of truth—verses 27-28

- A. Those far from Him shall perish
 1. It is good to be near God
- B. They are called to tell of His works

V. So What??!!

- A. It is easy to believe that the wicked prosper and the righteous suffer
 1. God sees all that happens
 2. God will give the people what they deserve
- B. When we forget to trust God and remember His deeds, this only gets worse
 1. We must go to Him in worship and remember how He has blessed us
 - a. His grace and forgiveness for us
- C. We are called to share what God has done for us

Psalm 84

Context

- A psalm written by sons of Korah
 - They were Levites assigned to guard the threshold of Sanctuary- 1 Chronicles 9:19
 - Korah rebelled against Moses (Numbers 16) and was slain by the Lord but his sons did not die for his sin (Numbers 26:11)
- Celebrating the pilgrimage to temple in Jerusalem

Outline

- I. **We are blessed in His Presence—verses 1-4**
 - A. Lovely is His dwelling place
 - B. Our souls long to be with Him
 1. We were made for communion with Him
 2. Living God and Lord of Hosts
 - C. Being with Him is our home
 1. Like birds in nests
 - D. We worship Him in His house
 1. We can worship God anywhere
 2. God has set apart the church for people to worship Him together
 - a. Called to join together as God's people in worship
 - b. Psalm 149:1
 3. God blesses us in our worship—verse 4
- II. **We are blessed by His strength—verses 5-9**
 - A. Our strength comes from Him
 1. Even in difficult places

- 2. Valley of Baca was dry and barren
- B. Strengthened as we are with Him
 - 1. Appearing before Him
- C. We are strengthened because He hears our prayers
 - 1. He is our shield

III. We are blessed in trusting Him—verses 10-12

- A. One day with God is better than thousands elsewhere
 - 1. "Our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you" –Augustine
 - 2. God is infinitely better than what we can understand
- B. Better to serve the Lord than live with the world
 - 1. Doorkeeper was one of lowest servants at the temple
 - 2. Being at the door meant you only got a small taste of the temple
 - a. Still better than fully living in tents of the world
- C. He is our sun and shield
 - 1. Provides for us—like the sun
 - a. Doesn't withhold good from us
 - b. Not one good thing
 - 2. Protects us—like a shield

IV. So What??!!

- A. We are to seek to be in God's Presence
 - 1. Daily in His Word
 - 2. Often with His people in corporate worship
- B. We need to live in God's strength
 - 1. See ourselves as needy sinners like Jacob
 - 2. Believe that He is with us daily
- C. We need to trust Him
 - 1. Find our value in God's Presence
 - 2. Seek to serve Him rather than ourselves

Context

- A psalm written by David
- Musical instructions are not expressly given so could be a song or a prayer

Outline

- I. The benefits of God to His people
 - A. Forgives ALL our iniquity and heals ALL our diseases
 1. Hebrew word for forgive is only used for God's action towards sinners
 2. Word for iniquity is picture of something twisted and distorted
 3. Slow to anger—verse 8
 - a. Doesn't keep His anger forever
 - b. Even though He has a right to
 4. Doesn't treat us as our sins deserve—verse 10
 - a. Mercy—not getting what we deserve
 - b. Our sins deserve death
 5. Separates us from our sin
 - a. Takes it away from us
 - b. As far as the east is from the west—verse 12
 - c. Picture of the scapegoat—Leviticus 16:6-10
 - i. Sin of the people was placed on the goat
 - ii. Goat was sent away from the people
 - iii. Their "sin" was separated from them

6. Took our sins upon Himself at the cross
 - B. Redeems our life from the pit
 1. Picture of God getting His people out of Egypt
 2. The Pit is pointing to Sheol
 - a. Psalm 6:5, 16:10, 28:1
 - b. Idea of destruction
 3. Gives us righteousness and justice—verse 6
 4. Knows that man's days are fleeting—verses 14-16
 - C. Crowns us with steadfast love and mercy
 1. As king—verse 19
 - a. Gives us His crown
 2. Abounding in steadfast love
 - a. As high as the heavens are above the Earth—verse 11
 - b. Everlasting to those who fear Him—verse 17
 - D. Satisfies us with good
 1. Has compassion on us like a father
 2. Only He can truly satisfy us
 - a. Isaiah 55:1-2
- II. Our response to His benefits**
- A. Worship
 1. Bless the Lord
 - a. "Delight His heart by expressing love and gratitude for all He is and all He does"
 2. Comes from our soul
 - B. Let our whole lives be worship to Him
 1. All that is within us
 - a. Word "all" is used 9 times in this psalm
 - b. Idea is total devotion to the Lord
 2. Heart, soul, mind and strength—Mark 12:28-31

- a. Not just worship but obedience to Him

III. So What??!!

- A. We need to constantly remember what God has done for us
 1. Pours out His grace and mercy
 2. Forgives and takes away our sin
 3. Saves our lives from the destruction we deserve
- B. We need to worship Him in response to all He has done
 1. With singing AND obedience
 2. With all that is in us

 2. Where we are at all times
 3. We cannot hide from God
 - a. Genesis 3:8-9
 - B. Our thoughts
 1. Knows them even when we seem far away from Him
 - C. Our actions
 1. Acquainted with ALL that we do
 2. God sees all that we do at all times
 - D. Our words
 1. Even before we speak them
 2. Before it is on our tongues
- II. The Lord is with us—verses 5-12
 - A. Cares for us
 1. Hems us in
 - a. Word means to guard a valuable object

- b. Provides a fence of protection for us to keep us from danger and evil
- 2. Hand is upon us
 - a. Leads us
 - i. Like leading a child by the hand across the street
 - b. Holds us
 - i. Like comforting a child when he is hurt
- B. Can't escape Him
 - 1. From highest heaven to deepest depths
 - a. Up to heaven
 - b. Down to Sheol
 - 2. From East to West
 - i. Wings of the morning—far East
 - 1. Where the sun rises each day
 - ii. Uttermost parts of the sea
 - 1. Mediterranean Sea was the far west border of Israel
 - 3. From day to night
 - a. Darkness is as light to God
 - b. Can see us even when we can't see ourselves

III. The Lord made us—verses 13-18

- A. Knitted us in mother's womb
 - 1. Wove us together
- B. Saw our frame from the beginning
 - 1. Even before we were born we could not hide from God
- C. Numbered our days
 - 1. God has a plan for your entire life
 - i. Knew it all even before you were born
 - ii. Job 14:5
- D. Made us wonderfully
 - 1. Nothing was by accident

2. Made us as He intended for His purpose
 - i. Set us apart
3. God doesn't make mistakes in creating us
- E. Thinks about us
 1. We are constantly on God's mind
 2. His thoughts are precious to us because we are precious to Him

IV. The Lord judges us—verses 19-24

- A. God will deal with those against Him
 1. We can trust Him
- B. God wants us to be concerned more with our own hearts
 1. We quickly look to sins of others but not at our own
 - i. Matthew 7:3-5
 2. We are called to ask God to examine our hearts
 - i. Not just what we do but why we do it
 - ii. We want God to reveal our sins
 1. So we can confess them to Him who graciously forgives
 2. So we can recognize it as sin and turn away from it

V. SO WHAT??!!

- A. God knows us better than anyone else
 1. Knows absolutely everything about us
 2. And yet He still loves us and sent Jesus to die for us
 - i. Can be confident in His love
 3. Therefore we can't deceive Him
- B. God is with us constantly
 1. Sees all that we say and do
 2. Therefore, we cannot escape Him
- C. God made us wonderfully

1. Intentionally and purposefully
2. Therefore, we cannot ignore Him
